Description of the event	<p>A group of twenty one students went on a trip to Udaipur, Haldighati &amp; Mount Abu. The students were accompanied by two faculty members. The group stayed at Vishnupriya Hotel, Udaipur.</p> <p>The group went to Pratap Smarak Maharana Pratap Memorial, Saheliyon-ki-Bari &amp; Fatah Sagar Lake and Handicraft Emporium &amp; Haldighati on day one. Pratap Smarak Maharana Pratap Memorial in Udaipur is the one of the most well known tourist attractions of the city. Situated on the Moti Magri or pearl Hill is the bronze statuette of Maharana on his favorite horse Chetak which is called the Maharana Pratap Memorial. Sightseeing in Udaipur is incomplete without visiting this place.</p> <p><b>Saheliyon-ki-Bari</b> (Courtyard of the Maidens) is a major garden and a popular tourist space in Udaipur in Indian state of Rajasthan. It lies in northern part of the city and has fountains and kiosks, a lotus pool and marble elephants. It was built by</p>

Maharana Bhopal Singh. Saheliyon ki Bari means Garden of the Maids. There is a small museum there as well.

Fatah Sagar Lake is said to be the pride of the City of Lakes of Udaipur, it is an artificial lake constructed by Maharana in north of Lake Pichola in 1678 and to the north-west of Udaipur, Haldighati. The day ended with a DJ & Bonfire where everyone tapped their feet.

On day two the group visited Mount Abu and saw the picturesque beauty of Dilwara Jain Temple, International Peace Centre of Brahmakumari. The trip was an amalgam of natural beauty & spiritual attainment. On day three the City Palace of Udaipur was appreciated.
