<b>Event Report in brief:</b>	<p>There were twenty nine teams in all. And one team consisted of two members. The students had to go through three rounds</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Qualifying round consisting of Data Analysis and Data Interpretation</li><li>• General Knowledge related to Business</li><li>• Test of Management Principles</li></ul> <p>Out of a total of twenty nine teams, ten teams could make it to the second round on the basis of cut off set by the instructors. Total of the last two rounds made up for the final score of the students.</p> <p>This was an online test, taken simultaneously for the students of MBA and MCA. The qualifying round was common for both the streams, after which the question bank prepared by RDIAS faculty was different for MBA and MCA students.</p> <p>The event lasted three hours and indeed we saw students thinking, pondering and scratching their head to perform and be a winner.</p> <p>It certainly was a test of the students mental ability, judged by all possible means and directions.</p>
